A Small Price to Pay for Excellence

One of the most beautiful neighborhoods in Detroit is Rosedale Park. The major reason: we are organized. The Rosedale Park Improvement Association:

- Lobbied the Wayne County Commission to pave Fenkell.
- Helped write the city ordinance regulating medical marijuana.
- Maintains the largest block captain network of any neighborhood organization in Detroit.
- Is currently urging the City Council to pass ordinances to regulate rental properties in Detroit.
- Pays for the plowing of the streets.

The largest chunk of the dues pays for snow plowing. The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's official winter forecast puts Michigan "...in the heart of an active storm track this winter." This means a higher than average snowfall predicted for our area.

The RPIA is also responsible for: the Island Beautification Committee; free weekly e-Blast; maintaining the entrance facades and signage; The Rosedale Park News and RPIA website; New Neighbor Kits; 30-block Garage Sale; Holiday Pancake Breakfast; volunteers who work hard to keep Flintstone Park beautiful; officers and board members who will listen to you and fight for you.

The annual dues are \$45 (\$25 Outer Dr. and Evergreen because the Wayne County plows those streets.) To pay online, go to our webpage, www.rosedalepark.org.
